Social Security Reform

To ensure fiscal balance and guaranteeing the current and future payment of Social Security, the Reform positively impacted 31 million beneficiaries and restructured the Brazilian model that covers more than 71 million policyholders. The Reformation should save more than R\$ 800 billion over the next ten years.

Simplification of the operating authorization of foreign companies

Act of the Federal Government that delegated to the Ministry of Economy the authority to carry out the acts of approval of the opening of foreign branches in the country, reducing the period of installation from 45 days to just 3 days.

Brazil is recognized as the 7th global leader in Digital Government

Brazil is recognized by the World Bank as the 7th country with the highest maturity in Digital Government in the world. Among the top 10, Brazil is the only country with a population over 100 million.

Proposition and regulation of the Economic Freedom Act

Inspired by the best practices of the private sector, the Declaration of Economic Liberty aimed to reclassify the licensing levels of enterprises of all sizes so that public effort is directed to situations that actually demand State attention, eliminating inefficient bureaucracy.

Autonomy of the Central Bank

The autonomy of the Central Bank aligns the Brazilian legislation with the best international practices in public governance, by providing monetary stability and stability of the inflation control, regardless of political pressures.

Simplification of rules and regulations at the Federal level

Program that aims on simplifying all federal regulations through the revision of all normative acts inferior to the decrees issued by all agencies and entities of the Federal Public Administration.

Covid-19

Acquired more than 600 million doses of vaccine, 3rd country in the world in terms of vaccination, in absolute numbers.

Covid-19 and Economy

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) recognized the quality of the Brazilian strategy to combat the social impacts of the pandemic, with emphasis on the country's economic performance. According to the IMF, the Brazilian model significantly reduced the severity of the 2020 recession and cushioned its impact on the most vulnerable population, while setting the stage for a strong recovery in 2021. The IMF further commended the momentum of institutional reforms despite the pandemic, to create the foundations for a more competitive economy.

Economic Data 2021

GDP

The Brazilian GDP grew by 1% in the first quarter of the year, contrary to the IMF's expectation, which estimated that Brazil would grow only 0.3% throughout the year.

Fiscal Surplus

Just in April, the Brazilian fiscal surplus was 8 billion dollars, the best result for this index in 21 years. The country has been in fiscal surplus uninterruptedly for 9 months.

Social Security

Government debts, which includes Social Security, plus the debts of all states and municipalities, is 78.3% of the Gross Domestic Product, at a lower level than the pre-pandemic period, and 57.9% considering only the Federal Government's debt.

Employments

Unemployment dropped to 10.5%, considering that only people looking for jobs and not finding them are unemployed, totaling more than 100 million workers with formal jobs.

Inflation

Inflation for the month of May was 0.42%, also below all forecasts that estimated between 0.7 and 1%. The country has not issued currency since 2019.

International Reserves

In the external dimension, Brazil has 360 billion dollars in international reserves, a value well above the sum of external debts.

A group of only 600 cities will be responsible for leveraging 2/3 of worldwide economic growth in the next 8 years. 400 of these cities are located in emerging countries, and 10 of them are in Brazil. Among them, Campinas is the only «engine-city», that is not a state capital.

Crossed by 5 of the most important roads of the country – and 60 minutes away from Brazil's financial capital –, Campinas is home to the largest cargo airport in Latin America.

The metropolitan areas of Campinas and São Paulo (Capital) are in an advanced stage of conurbation. Together, they compound the first macrometropolis in the southern hemisphere, an «Expanded Metropolitan Complex» with over 34 million inhabitants.

Human capital

Campinas is also home to the largest State University in the country and one of the most respectable institutions in the world for scientific research and patent registration, hosting more than 400 scientific events per year.

Two more of the city's universities (da América Latina) are among the top ten private learning institutions of Brazil, and together they are responsible for the region's high levels of Intellectual Capital and specialized workforce, including the study and practice of Law.

Furthermore, Campinas is host to the Sirius, the number one synchrotron light producing particle accelerator in the world, used for research at the atomic and molecular levels. The investment came directly from the Ministry for Science, Technology and Innovation, taking biological and materials related research to the limit of what physics can achieve.

The metropolis has the 9th GDP of the country, above more than half the state capitals, hosting technology hubs and many industries, such as software, logistics, microelectronics, agrotechnology, as well as medical and pharmaceutical manufacturers.

The City has high level bilingual schools and one military school, 26 parks and groves, environmental reserves and permanent protection areas for fauna and flora, infrastructure, connectivity, leisure and quality services to welcome foreign executives and their families.

Campinas is also one of the main business tourism destination and events host in South America, featuring, therefore, a vast network of hotels, spas and luxury resorts, not mentioning the highest concentration of polo fields, horseback riding, jumping and endurance riding facilities and golf courses in the country.
